Kelowna Flightcraft Background

Kelowna Flightcraft operates or leases over 50 aircraft; is Canada's third largest airline; is an aircraft maintenance and manufacturing organization; is a Transport Canada Design Approval organization (engineering); owns the type certificate for the Convair airplane, and is a Transport Canada Approved Training Organization delivering training to a wide range of aviation companies. In operation since 1970, Kelowna Flightcraft is ISO 9001 certified and employs 1000 employees across Canada with our head office located in Kelowna, BC.

Kelowna Flightcraft's full service **Aircraft Maintenance Operations** focus on heavy aircraft maintenance, overhaul, and modifications with major facilities in Kelowna, BC and Hamilton, ON. This includes mechanical, structures, avionics, engine, landing gear, painting & parts supply with a focus on B727, B737, B757, B767; DH-8, and Convair 580 and 5800 stretch.

Kelowna Flightcraft's **Charter Operations** deliver over 600,000 lbs of freight nightly across Canada utilizing a fleet of seventeen B727's and Convair 580's.

Kelowna Flightcraft's **Allied Wings Operation** provides Primary and Advanced Military Flight Training for Canada's Air Force at the Canada Wings Aviation Training Centre. Based in Southport, Manitoba (5 minutes from Portage la Prairie, MB) over 100 pilots are trained annually utilizing a fleet of 39 aircraft (Grob120A, King Air C90B, Bell 206, and Bell 412) and 3 state-of-the-art flight simulators.

PFI Aviation Background

PFI has been operating for 11 years, providing both pilot and maintenance training in Canada and abroad. After receiving Transport Canada approval as an Approved Training Organization in 2002, PFI has grown steadily in course offerings and customers. At the present time, the PFI Statement of Limitations includes 11 aircraft types, with another awaiting the initial course presentation prior to final approval.
